Labette Community College Classes for Fall 2019

Galena High School junior and senior students are given the opportunity to take college classes through Labette Community College while they are still in high school. Students are able to take these classes based on the following criteria: required individual (Reading, Math) scores on the ACT or Accuplacer placement test for English and Math classes, teacher recommendations, attendance, grades, completed payment form, etc. Accuplacer testing will begin the week of April 16-19 with LCC enrollment taking place the first week in May. Each year, LCC offers most of our students what is called a Jump Start Scholarship. This scholarship pays for the tuition for the classes, but not the fees that are associated with them. Students are still responsible for paying these fees, which amount to \$51 for each credit hour. Students will earn 3 credit hours for each of the classes listed below, with the exception of Advanced Biology. This class lasts the entire school year, while each of the others only lasts one semester. The Intro to Teaching class and Pre Professional Lab must be taken at the same time. There is an additional \$2 fee for students that are taking the English Comp I class.

Juniors and seniors are also allowed to take other LCC online classes. In order for students to be successful in these online classes, they need to have self motivation. Unless students are motivated to work on their own and stick to guidelines set up by the online teachers, they might not do well in online classes. Please discuss this option with your child to determine if it will allow him/her to be successful.
