### February

Watch the mail or your email for acceptance letters from colleges.

Begin applying for local scholarships. Applications will be posted on the district website. They are also announced on Facebook as they become available.

### March

Monitor your e-mail for the "Student Aid Report (SAR)." This is a report showing the results of the FAFSA.

Check with your college's financial aid office to make sure they have everything they need.
