Focus One: Kansas State Assessments

Performance Target 1: All students will meet or exceed the state average as measured by the Kansas Assessment Program. A special focus will continue to be placed on the performance of identifiable subgroups as well as the percent of students scoring at levels 3 and 4.

- Continue to use professional learning communities as the backbone of collaboration within schools.
- Provide long term, job embedded professional development for teachers and school-based administrators. Professional Development will focus on effective instructional practices in the content areas.
- Continue to assist schools in the development of school learning plans that reflect school data, outcome goals, professional development and student well-being.
- Continue to expand the use of curriculum mapping as a planning and recording tool for instruction, school improvement, and curriculum development.
- Develop support for new teachers and administrators, aspiring teacher leaders and aspiring principals in order to build the instructional leadership capacity of our staff.
- Increase the availability of data systems for use by school staff to determine student progress.



Focus Two: Local Assessments

Performance Target 2:

- The district will participate in a variety of local assessments to be used as progress monitoring tools
- K-10 students will participate in testing three times each year in order to provide diagnostic and progress data. A special focus will continue to be placed on individual student scores and progress.
- Students will participate in other grade level appropriate testing
- All students, by the end of 3rd grade, will be on grade level in Reading.
 - o Plans of action will be monitored and identified for all students
- Kindergarten through tenth grade will use MAP testing data 3 times each year to monitor student progress



Focus Three: College and Career Readiness

Performance Target 3: Students will be provided with the experiences and opportunities to be "ready" for college and career. A special focus will be placed on graduating all students with industry recognized certifications.

- Continue Individual Plans of Study at the middle school and high school levels
- Continue to identify useful certifications that will help students after graduation
- Counseling and advisory curriculums will include "college and vocational knowledge" lessons and activities, individual goal setting, and career planning.
- Percentage of Galena High School graduates returning for their second year of college will increase
- Support teachers in the implementation of instructional practices and programs that engage student learners



Focus Four: Social Emotional Learning

Performance Target 4: All students will be provided with opportunities for social emotional learning.

- All schools will continue to survey students to check for Social Emotional Needs.
- The district will develop and implement professional development for all staff.
- Each school's well-being plan will address student understandings of diversity and cultural competence.
- All schools will promote student opportunities to demonstrate community service behaviors.
- All schools will promote student opportunities in co-curricular and extracurricular activities.
- The district will maintain a good partnership with Spring River Mental Health and the Community Health Center.



Focus Five: Technology

Performance Target 4: Students and Staff will be provided the tools needed to be successful. A special focus will be placed on our middle school and high school technology programs that will provide enhanced opportunities for students.

- Continue to support our district wide one to one technology initiative
- Continue to support a learning management system that teachers, students, and parents can access
- Continue to support the middle school/high school technology program, encouraging it to be used by a large number of students
- Continue to provide training opportunities, led by USD 499 technology staff, to the district.
