YEARBOOKS: It's time to think of ordering a yearbook. Yearbooks are ordered completely online. Go to <a href="www.jostens.com">www.jostens.com</a>, at the top of the page to "Our Collections". In the drop down box, click "Buy Your Yearbook". Enter "liberty elementary galena" in the search bar and the school will pop up on the drop down menu, select it and it will take you to the "Buy Your Liberty Elementary School Yearbook", click on "Order Your Yearbook" and from there just follow the instructions. Elementary yearbooks are \$20. High School yearbooks are \$50. **JUST A REMINDER:** If you have notified the office that your child will be absent, you will still receive the automated phone call that they have been marked absent. The Spring Grove office has no way to stop the automated phone call.

MESSAGE FROM THE NURSE: Dear Parents, If you are called to come pick up your child because they have a fever or are throwing up, they need to stay home for 24 hours before returning to school. Students must be fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications before they are allowed to return to school. This is for the safety of your child as well as others. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

**LET'S TALK ABOUT THE WEATHER:** It's the time of year for "unpredictable weather", will it be warm or cold?, rain or snow?, we don't know . . . . Here are the "Weather Cancellation Procedures". School will not be dismissed because of storms that arise during the school day as long as it is feasible for students and teachers to remain at school safely. Parents are urged not to send their children to school when storm conditions exist or road conditions are such as to create a definite hazard.

School cancellation announcements will be broadcast on local TV and radio stations. We also have an automated messenger system in place to contact you with cancellation information and important information about school activities. Phone numbers are already in the system so you should receive a call and/or text message if we have the correct phone number on file. This is why it is important to make sure you keep your phone number updated with the school office. Notices will also be posted on the District Facebook and Web page as well as the class Facebook pages.

**COATS & JACKETS:** Cold weather is here. Please make sure your child is dressed for the colder temperatures and has a coat or jacket. Also, please make sure your child's name is on a tag somewhere in their coat or jacket and on all their personal. belongings so they can be returned to the right owner when found in the lunchroom, the hallway, the restroom or on the playground. If your child receives a new coat or jacket, hat & gloves for Christmas, please make sure to put their name somewhere on a tag in the new items. We don't want them to get lost because there isn't a name in them. Thank you.
