MASKS: This year masks are encouraged but not required in our buildings. However, masks are required on busses and in school vehicles. If your child rides a bus, please make sure they have a mask. Please make sure you wash your child's mask. Thank you.

<u>WATER BOTTLES:</u> Please make sure your child has a water bottle when they come to school. Our water fountains are still unavailable for use but we do have bottle fillers. Please, do not fill your child's water bottle before they come to school. If the lid is not tight, water leaks out into the backpack, on everything in the backpack, and eventually on the floor. We have bottle fillers here and time for them to fill their bottle when they get here. When they come already filled they sometimes leak and spill. Thank you for your cooperation.

<u>DISMISSAL:</u> Please make sure that the office is aware of any changes to your child's routine as to how they get home after school. We will not drop off our Kindergarten through 2nd grade students at a bus stop if a parent or older sibling is not present or visible to the bus driver.

NAMES: Please put your child's name on all his/her personal items that he/she might bring to school. We can't return it to the owner if there isn't a name.
