

Areas of District Attention for School Safety

Student safety is a priority for us at Galena School District. Here is a list of some of our current actions to promote an even more safe environment in our schools.

- 1. Counselors are reviewing current anti-bullying activities/lessons/curriculum and reviewing information regarding Challenge Day and other possible programs.
- 2. Teachers and administrators have frequent conversations about supervision and visibility in the hallways during passing time.
- 3. A video surveillance camera has been added at the middle school. Additionally, our administrative team has evaluated a schematic drawing of the campus surveillance system and is developing recommendations for possible additions and/or modifications.
- 4. Administrators have investigated a variety of available vape detector options. In order to make a solid, long term decision, our team has researched the best product to meet our needs. Some of the variables in the process include types of detectors, installation requirements and possible vendor bidding requirements. The restrooms on our main campus are garnering attention.
- 5. District personnel and representatives from the Cherokee County Sheriff's office have coordinated efforts to utilize county K-9 units in an effort to prevent the presence of inappropriate substances on the middle school and high school campuses. A soft lockdown is ordered when the K-9 Unit is on campus for this purpose.
- 6. Providing public information after a school lockdown has been added to our procedures.
- 7. School staff have surveyed area schools' discipline grids related to bullying. The comparison of discipline steps taken by area schools is being used by the BOE in the process of reviewing our current policies.

Information related to bullying

Teachers are trained annually in identifying and preventing bullying in schools. The key to dealing with potential bullying situations is reporting to administrators, counselors or teachers as soon as possible so the incident can be properly investigated and addressed. Students are continuously reminded to report situations that might be dangerous or constitute bullying to an adult in the building. We investigate and address all concerns that are brought to our attention.

All circumstances are dealt with in a manner consistent with our policies and procedures with the intent to provide a safe learning environment and support students in developing respectful habits for dealing with each other. Please note that in these situations, there is always "more to the story" than school officials can share publicly as we are mandated under the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) to protect student identity and cannot disclose specific information about student behaviors and/or consequences.

What steps or actions can concerned parents take?
